Juan José Alba Ríos is currently Director of Regulatory Affairs at Endesa. He joined Endesa in July 1997. He is currently in charge of regulatory affairs of Endesa for Spain and Portugal, where he is involved in all the aspects of the business: design of the wholesale market, remuneration of distribution, tariffs and grid access charges, capacity payments, CO2 allocations, etc., as well as European legislation. Juan J. Alba is chairman of the WG Wholesale Markets and Trading of Eurelectric, as well as member of the board of directors of EFET (the European Federation of Energy Traders), and co-chairman of its WG on financial regulation. He has been a member of the Supervisory Boards of Powernext and Gielda Energii S.A. (Polish Power Exchange). He has a PhD in electrical engineering from Universidad Pontificia Comillas in Madrid.

José Braz is the Chairman of the CEER 3rd Package Working Group – he is a member of the Executive Board of ERSE, the Portuguese Energy Regulator, since January 2007 and was previously responsible for dealing with Regulated Markets at the Portuguese Competition Authority – other past functions include heading the Portuguese Insurance and Pension Fund Regulatory Authority, being Secretary of State for the Treasury, and Senior Economist at the International Monetary Fund.

Emmanuel Cabau is an administrator within the Directorate General for Transport and Energy at the European Commission. He coordinated the work on the Third Internal Energy Legislative Package within this DG.

Paolo Chiricozzi is graduated in law and attended a Master in EU Laws, Politics and Antitrust. He joined Enel in 2000 and has managed the main antitrust cases during the last 9 years (Mergers, Joint Ventures, State Aid Cases, Abuse of dominant position cases) at national and European level. In 2007 he has been appointed Head of Market and Competition and since October 2008 he is the Head of European Regulation and Antitrust of Enel Group, based in Brussels.

Carlo Crea graduated in 1980 in Law and successively specialized in Public Administration, International Cooperation and Strategic Marketing. He is currently the Secretary General at the Italian Regulatory Authority for Electricity and Gas but has extensively worked as high ranking civil servant and as Director in main energy companies since 1985, when he started working at the Italian Ministry of the Interior. He has then worked as Legal Adviser at the Oil Division of the Italian Ministry of Industry and Trade; as Executive for Foreign Affairs Division of General Directorate of Energy Sources at the Italian Ministry of Industry and Trade; as Director of European Institutional Relations of EDISON SpA and as Head of International Affairs in GRTN (Italian independent system operator). He has written several papers on energetic issues and has been member of several Board of national and international organizations. He has been awarded merit honours by the President of the Italian Republic.

Martin Crouch is Director of European Strategy and Environment. He leads the team which provides Ofgem's input into developing genuinely competitive and sustainable European gas and electricity markets and facilitating the transition to a low carbon energy sector. He joined Ofgem as Director, Electricity Distribution in January 2003. He was responsible for the fourth electricity distribution price review which introduced new regulatory mechanisms, provided for significant increases in investment and increased emphasis on outputs and environmental incentives. He oversaw the introduction of annual cost reporting after the review and has directed reviews of charging, competition in connections and distributed energy. Prior to joining Ofgem, Martin worked for an electricity company on commercial, financial and regulatory issues, including the sales of two British distribution and supply businesses and the renegotiation of financial arrangements for a power station joint venture. Before that, he was an economic consultant at National Economic Research Associates (NERA) working primarily on regulatory and industry restructuring projects in the energy sector.

Jos Delbeke (1954, Belgium), Deputy Director-General of the European Commission's DG Environment since 2008. He was very involved in negotiations on the package on climate change and energy in the EU Council and Parliament. Mr Delbeke has also been a key player in developing Europe's International Climate Change strategy, its legislation on cars and fuels, the European Emissions Trading Scheme, and legislation on air quality and emissions from big industrial installations. He joined the European Commission in 1986 and was very active on market-based instruments, on cost-benefit analysis, and on the new chemicals legislation REACH. For several years now he has been the European Commission's chief negotiator at the UNFCCC Conference of the Parties. He holds a PhD in economics and has lectured at the University of Louvain in Belgium. In 1985, he worked temporarily for the International Monetary Fund in Washington.

Daniel Dobbeni is Chief Executive Officer and President of the Executive Committee of ELIA SYSTEM OPERATOR s.a., the Belgian Transmission System Operator. He is also Chairman of the Board of Belpex, the Belgian Power Exchange. He serves as President of Synergrid, the Belgian association of Transmission and Distribution System Operators for gas and electricity. At the European level, he was recently elected as President of ENTSO-E (European Network of Transmission System Operators for Electricity) that will become, after the winding-up of the six existing associations, the single TSO association with 42 companies from 34 countries. Author of several publications, he has participated in several work groups and conferences in Europe and North America. During his career, he worked actively in several commissions for the Electric Power Research Institute, the American Society of Mechanical Engineers as well as the European Commission (R&D Esprit programs).

Eric Dyèvre graduated from the French Naval Academy in 1975. Specialized in artillery and missiles, he experienced active service on different warships in France and overseas. He was an instructor at the Naval Academy of Annapolis (USA) for two years. A high ranking civil servant since 1988, he worked at the ministries of Interior and of Industry until 1997. Then, joining Charbonnages de France, the French national coal company, he was first the chief finance officer and later deputy general manager of the company. In 2003, he became the chief executive officer of the subsidiary SNET, today Eon-France, a power company. He was appointed commissioner at the Commission de Régulation de l'Énergie (CRE) by the chairman of the National Assembly in April 2004.

Dörte Annemarie Fouquet, born in 1957, is partner of Kuhnert law firm and German lawyer in Brussels. During her professional career Mrs Fouquet specialised in various legal aspects of energy, environmental, competition and administrative law. Her major focus in counselling is on issues in the field of Energy Law, especially in relation to Renewable Energies and Energy Efficiency. She also works in the area of industrial environmental legislation especially on regulations in the field of environment, energy, trade law, competition law, as in general on standard-setting on the base of Best Available Technology Principle and the realistic planning towards approximation of EU legislation, enforcement and application. Since 2000 she is Director of EREF, the European Renewable Energies Federation and representing the Federation in Brussels and on European level.

Jean-Michel Glachant is Director of the Florence School of Regulation. He also holds the Loyola de Palacio Chair in European Energy Policy. PhD in economics from la Sorbonne University, he has been Professor at La Sorbonne and at Université Paris-Sud, where he founded the energy research team "Groupe Réseaux Jean-Monnet" and recently the European Erasmus Mundus Master EMIN (Economics and Management of Network Industries). He has been advisor in energy policy of DG TREN, DG COMP and DG RESEARCH at the European Commission and advisor of the French Energy Regulatory Commission (CRE). He is or has been coordinator or scientific advisor of several European energy research projects (SESSA, CESSA, Reliance, TradeWind, EU-Deep, RefGov). He is research partner in the "Centre for Energy and Environmental Policy Research" at MIT (USA), the "Electricity Policy Research Group" at Cambridge University and the "European Energy Institute" at University of Leuven.

Fernando Lasheras is since 2001 the Director of Iberdrola's Representative Office in Brussels. He has a Degree on Electrical Engineering and a broad experience both in the Operation and Regulation of Electricity Sectors. He began his professional activity in Iberduero in 1976 as responsible for the security functions in the Energy Management System. In 1986, he joined Red Eléctrica, the Spanish TSO, as Deputy Manager of the Northern Regional Centre. In 1996, he returned to Iberdrola as Director of Regulatory Development. He was involved in the design and development of the Spanish Electricity Market. His current duties are the institutional representation in Brussels and the follow-up of the regulations that come from the EU institutions.

Hervé Mignon is currently Director of the Grid Development and Energy Outlook Department at RTE. Hervé joined RTE in June 2002, and had the opportunity, as Head of the Staff of the CEO, to contribute to the institutional aspects of the regulatory framework and corporate structure of RTE. He has previously held different positions within the French Administration: he was Head of the Fuel Cycle and Waste Management Department of the Nuclear Safety Authority, and Technical Advisor on Environmental Health at the Ministry of Health. Hervé is graduated from Ecole Polytechnique and from Ecole des Mines, Paris, France. He is also a member of X-Environnement association.

Pippo Ranci has been the first president of the Italian Regulatory Authority for electricity and gas (1996-2003) and co-founder and vice-president of the CEER. Then he set up and directed the Florence School of Regulation at the European University Institute (EUI) in Florence (2004-2008). Many times consultant to the Italian Government, in particular to the Ministry of Industry (1970s and 1980s); advisor to the President of the Council of Ministers (1992-93). He teaches at the Università Cattolica, Milano. Guest professor at the Barcelona Graduate School of Economics. Chairman of the scientific committee at the Center for Research on Energy and on Environmental Economics and Policy (IEFE) in the Università Bocconi, Milano.

Jan Sundell is Senior Adviser Regulatory Affairs at Vattenfall AB. He has a long experience from the different parts of the electricity value chain – generation, transmission, distribution, trading and sales – and his current responsibility is within Regulatory Affairs in the Vattenfall group office in Stockholm. Dr Sundell is also active in international organizations as Eurelectric and Cigré.

Gábor Szörényi graduated in 1971 from the Technical University of Budapest and started his business career at the Hungarian Power Companies (MVM). He spent 23 years there working on coordination of R&D, energy system planning, power plant investment, preparation of new market structure and privatisation, energy conservation, PR and related issues. In 1979 he received a doctorate degree from the Technical University of Budapest and in 1999 the degree of Master of Business Administration from the British Brunel University. Between 1992 and 94 he was president of the Board of Directors at the Vertesi Power Plant. Since August 1994, Mr. Szorenyi has been Deputy Director and since 2002 Director of the Hungarian Energy Office, the Hungarian energy regulatory authority; which is independent state agency regulating electricity, gas, district-heating sectors. He has long experience in the international cooperation. In 2008, according to the election of the ERRA General Assembly, Mr. Szorenyi stepped up to be a Chairman of the Energy Regulators Regional Association.
