Steps towards reaching the objective by WFER, October 2009

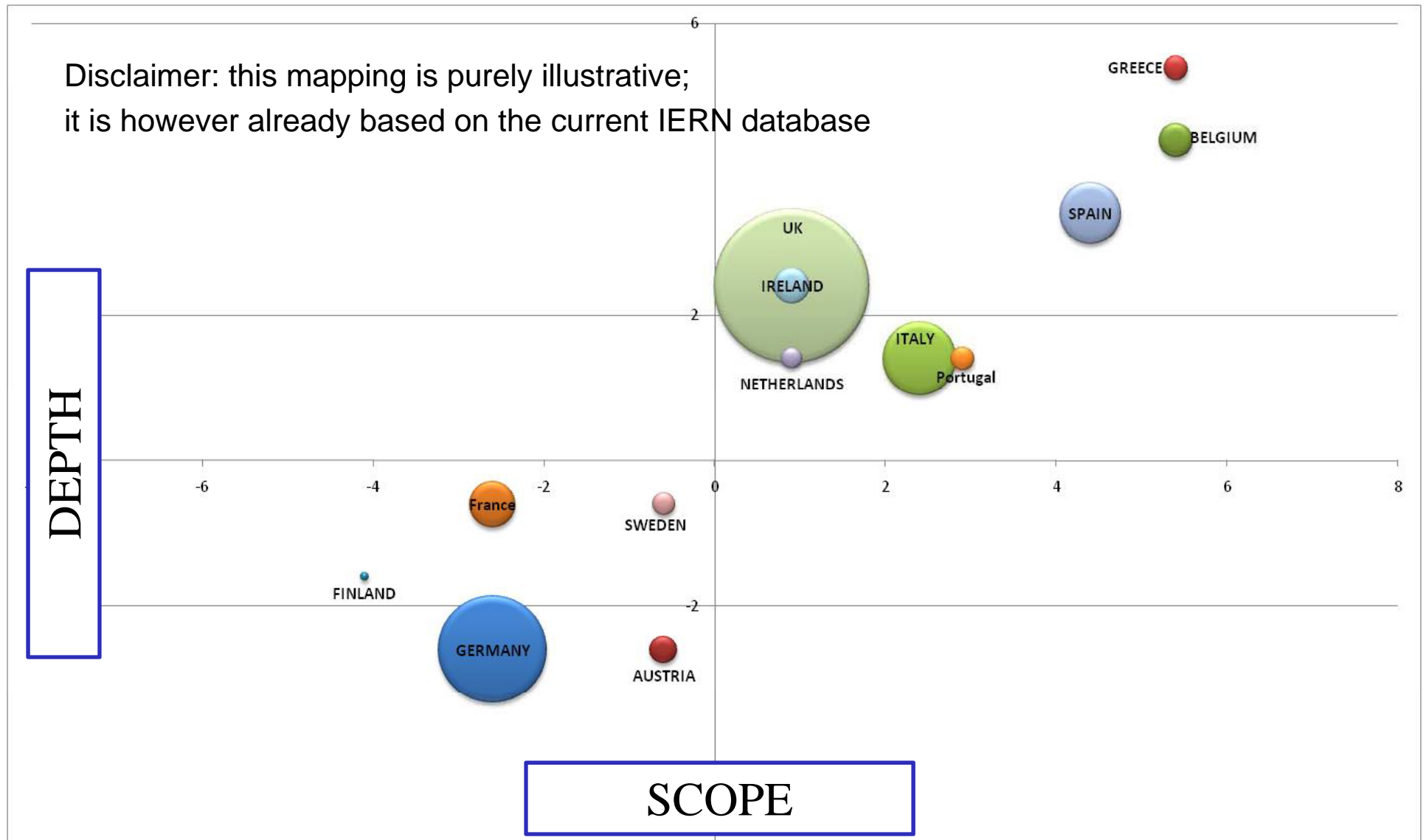
- 1st June:
 - Online survey ready for electricity regulators
 - *copy of survey is included in conference info pack*
 - Regulator contacts receive login and password
 - Regulatory contact points for Europe: FIERN task force members and CEER communication officers
- 1st July:
 - Start quality process of responses
 - Preparing to launch the new IERN
 - Preparing the mapping of regulators, based on the survey responses (answers after this deadline will not be included in the first mapping exercise)

After WFER

- Launch equivalent survey for gas regulators?
- Virtual working groups?
- Virtual community of regulatory experts?
(wikipedia type of knowledge base)

End Result will look like this:
