One copy should include author names and full contact details, the other one should be submitted blind (with no author names or contact details listed anywhere within the article). Articles will not be considered if multiple files are submitted-e.g., text files along with separate files with graphics, tables, equations, etc. Each of the two electronic files must incorporate all text, tables, equations and graphics. Articles should be easily readable and accessible to a broad readership including the academic community but also industry experts and policy makers.
